Stewardship Reflection: **Luke 4:21-30**

This passage is disturbing, for Jesus tells us that those on the 'inside' aren't necessarily the ones God chooses to touch in some way. How open are we ('the insiders') to receiving God through someone on 'the outside'?

**Fourth Sunday after Epiphany January 31, 2010**

*Anglican Cycle of Prayer: The Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia (New Zealand)*

*Canadian Partnerships: Anglican Indigenous Network*

*At their 11th official gathering, members of the Anglican Indigenous Network (AIN) learned they needed to choose a new secretary general when Malcolm Naea Chun announced he will be stepping down in 2011. There was much discussion. At the next plenary, the elders spoke.*

*Some of us elders feel compelled after last night's deliberation to say that we too feel the gravity [of finding] someone for our next Secretary-General. We want to do it in the way our peoples seek a leader among us—by consultation, by prayer, by looking in and out of ourselves...guided by the Holy Spirit. We are not to be rushed for expediency, as some do at tribal meetings bully[ing] us to silence. We ask that we can reflect upon the good people already mentioned, to talk privately with them, to go back home and to look among our own people deserving of being our secretary-general. Someone who can and will be able to work with all of us. Who will be...with us not just here, but when we need him or her standing with us on our land... We know this to be the ways of our peoples and are determined to keep AIN grounded in our indigenous way.*

*Six months later, the Anglican Indigenous Network elected Donna Bomberry as their new secretary-general. She is a member of the Cayuga Nation of the Six Nations Iroquois Confederacy and will continue as indigenous ministries coordinator for the Anglican Church of Canada's General Synod.*
